## Return to Learn Plan 2024-2025

Lomega Public Schools 2024-2025 school year is quickly approaching. Over the course of the last year, Lomega Public Schools have worked closely with many different groups to make adjustments to protocols and procedures, while maintaining a safe and healthy environment for both students and employees. Many of the lessons learned have contributed to the current 2024-2025 Return to Learn plan. This plan includes:

- 1. Health and Wellness** of our students and staff is our top priority. We appreciate everyone working together to keep our schools safe and healthy.
  - Vaccinations are encouraged, but not required, for all who are eligible. If you are fully vaccinated or positive COVID-19 within last 90 days – *You will not be required to quarantine and removed from any contact tracing.*
  - Regular hand washing and other recommended hygiene practices will be enforced and taught
  - Students exhibiting symptoms of illness, such as a fever of 100 degrees or higher, vomiting, or diarrhea will be isolated and parents will be required to pick up their child.
  - A Positive COVID-19 student may return when all of the following have been met:
    - Complete the recommended number of days of quarantine per CDC
    - Symptoms are improving and Fever-free without medications for at least 24 hours
    - Provided a doctor’s note with the Return to School date
  
- 2. Exposure Notification** - District officials will notify specific individuals, who were determined to be in close contact with the positive student or staff member. These individuals will be recommended to quarantine per CDC guidelines unless the individual has documentation of completed COVID-19 Vaccination or positive COVID-19 test in the last 90 days.
  
- 3. Masks** are recommended for all Staff and Students at school, gym, and on the buses. In compliance with Senate Bill 658, Masks may be required if a state of emergency is declared for Kingfisher County and after consultation with county and/or state health department officials.
  
- 4. Increased Cleaning/Sanitation and Visitor Protocols** will be continued across the district
  - Disinfectant will be used daily in classrooms, bathrooms, on doorknobs, and other frequently used surfaces
  - Electrostatic systems will be used to disinfect classrooms, bathrooms, and cafeteria daily
  - Hand sanitizer will be available in classrooms and common areas
  - Water fountains will be turned off, but the bottle fillers option will remain available. Students are encouraged to bring water bottles. All water bottles must be clear.
  - Lomega Elementary will be limited access to non-staff visitors - Please check-in at the office. Drop-off will be at the main doors and pickup will be on the playground.
  
- 5.** Please understand that this plan is and more than likely will remain in “Draft” status. While this plan will serve as a framework for us to begin school, any part of this plan can be adjusted at a moment’s notice based on the ever-changing data and information that we are presented with.
